






Spokane Tribal 477 Traffic Safety Education Assistance

The Spokane Tribal 477 Program strives to offer youth educational and employment opportunities to gain skills and knowledge to promote self-sufficiency. A new way to support this is by offering financial assistance to qualified youth to obtain a Washington State Driver's License. The 477 Program believes that not having a Driver's License is a barrier to employment and puts limits on youth and their goals. By assisting with these costs, youth will become legal drivers and have more opportunities for success.

Below are eligibility guidelines for Driver's Education Assistance:

- 477 clients who are at least 15 years old and are in good standing with their program requirements.
- Students must have an instruction/learners permit prior to starting courses.
- Complete a 477 Drivers Education application.

FEES INCLUDED BUT NOT LIMITED TO:

- Drivers School Course Fee
- DOL Learner's Permit
- DOL Enhanced Driver's License Application Fee
(Includes Application fee and Issuance fee)
- DOL Knowledge Test
- DOL Driving Test

FEES NOT ALLOWED:

- Admin Fee or Transfer Fees*

*Some Driving Schools require transfer fees for un-enrolling or transferring to other sessions. The 477 program will not assist in paying these fees.

→ **All fees are paid once per lifetime, per eligible youth.**

Program Requirements:

- Student must have their Traffic Safety Education class completed within 3 months of the first day of courses.
- Student must provide a copy of acquired Learner's Permit to the 477 program.
- Provide certificate of completion at the end of the Driving course and a copy of your driver's license (if one was obtained).
- All refunds must be returned to the 477 program immediately.
- Failure to return unused funds or complete the course will result in an overpayment.


Drivers Training programs must include all of the following:

1. A total of 30 hours of classroom instruction, with a maximum of 2 hours per day.
2. A minimum of 6 hours of practice driving, with a maximum of 1 hour per day.
3. A minimum of 1 hour of behind-the-wheel observation.

Online and parent-taught traffic safety education are **not** approved courses in Washington State. If your teen completes a course in another state it must meet Washington State minimum requirements.

Driving practice with parents :

Parents of teen drivers must supervise a total of 50 hours of out-of-class practice time, including 10 hours of nighttime driving.



How to choose a good Driver Training Program...

- Make sure the instructors and the schools are licensed. Schools are required to display certificates for each instructor, and each instructor must carry a wallet certificate.
- Compare the school's curriculum with the state curriculum requirements.
- Look for instructor-led classroom instruction that makes appropriate use of videos and visual aids.
- Make sure the school has enough instructors to meet the students' needs and answer their questions in the classroom.
- Ask how the school will keep records of your student's attendance and classroom and behind-the-wheel lessons. Request a copy so you can confirm the training.

Students must have an instruction permit to practice driving. Washington State Age Requirements for an instruction Permit:

Student's age	Requirements for an instruction permit
Under 15½	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Certificate of enrollment from the driver training school or instructor. • Parent's signature granting permission for the instruction permit.
15½–17	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pass the driver's knowledge test. • Parent's signature granting permission for the instruction permit.
18 and older	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pass the driver's knowledge test.
